4-H VOLUNTEER LEADER ORIENTATION INSTRUCTIONS

The **Alameda County 4-H Volunteer Leader Orientation** is an on-line process. This requirement applies to new volunteers and to returning volunteers who have 1 year or more break in service. Completing the orientation is part of the application process of becoming a 4-H volunteer leader. Please follow the steps below:

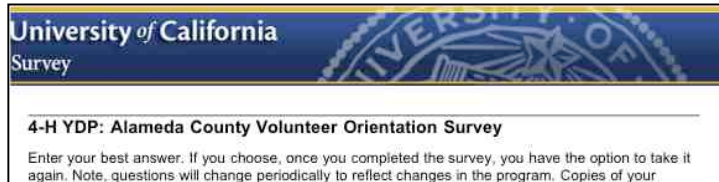
I. View the 4-H Orientation Video and complete the survey:

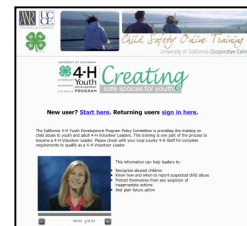
